## It's a family affair for Voss, JCA

Joliet Catholic's head coach Jared Voss bleeds brown and gold. This might sound cliché, but it's the best way to describe the man who led the undefeated Hilltoppers to the 2014 Phil Lawler Summer League State Championship.

Joliet Catholic Academy has been part of Voss's life since he was 14. He attended the school from 1988-92 where he was a three-sport athlete. competing in golf, wrestling, and baseball. On the diamond, he played for

IHSBCA Hall of Famer Joe Rodeghero. coach of the Hilltoppers. "I learned a lot from Coach Rodeghero," said Voss. "He has been one of my long-time mentors."

After college, Voss returned to his alma mater in 1996 and accepted a position as social studies teacher and assistant baseball coach. "It's funny how things worked out, but I actually took Coach Rodeghero's teaching position when he left Joliet Catholic to coach baseball at Providence." Two years later, Voss was named head


"This is really the only high school I've ever known," commented Voss. "I love it here and it's a big part of my family. It truly is a great place to work."

As much as Voss loves JCA, the feelings must be mutual. His success at the helm of the baseball program over the past 16 years is tough to match. Besides this year's summer championship, Voss brought home spring 3A titles in both 2009 and 2013. His teams also placed in State four other times (4th in 2010, 3rd in 2008, and 2nd in both 2000 and 2004) and won 11 Regional titles during his tenure.

With all his success, you might think capturing titles has gotten to be "old hat" for Voss, but nothing could be further from the truth. "This year's summer championship was just as fulfilling and exciting as the others. Watching the kid's reactions to being champs and watching them jump on the dog pile never gets old."

Going through the 2014 summer season and play-offs undefeated was special for Voss and his team, but at the same time, it certainly was not expected. "We did the typical mixing and matching throughout the summer season with so many players going in different directions because of our kids playing other sports or working," he said. "As a matter of fact, none or our kids threw more than two innings in any one outing and we always had a different team out there. I'm o.k. with this because more of the players get a chance to play. I only asked that we had a full squad during the play-offs."

Voss would definitely need "all hands on deck" when the play-offs started, as JCA had to navigate its way through



## Voss, JCA: 2014 Summer State Champions

the always tough Lockport Sectional. JCA's first round opponent, Lincoln Way North, wasn't the cake walk one would expect after finishing the regular season with a perfect record. "The Lincoln Way game might have been the toughest game we had in our playoff run and it was the opening game!" said Voss. The Hilltoppers, led by a superb outing from junior right-handed pitcher Drake Fellows, beat the Phoenix 1-0. After wins against other perennial powerhouse programs Plainfield North and Sandburg, JCA advanced to the final eight teams.

"We had some very exciting games in pool play, including two incredible walk-off wins," said Voss. Senior Connor Brandon provided the fireworks in the first game, driving in Nick Dalesandro with the game-winning run in the bottom of the seventh against Prairie Ridge. In the semi-final game, Fellows was the hero, knocking out Prospect High School 3-2 with his own walk-off RBI hit.

"I would love to say it was all coach-

ing," joked Voss, "but we are blessed to have such a talented group of kids at JCA." Four players – shortstop Mitch Boe (Iowa), pitcher Drake Fellows (Vanderbilt), pitcher Danny Ehrsam (SIU Edwardsville), and pitcher/catcher Nick Dalesandro (Purdue) – are already committed to Division I schools, and Keegan Tyrell, who Voss says is just as talented as the others, has yet to commit.

While there certainly is no dearth of talent at JCA, it is Jack Kaiser Summer League Tournament MVP Dalesandro that "stirs our drink," according to Voss. "The team feeds off Nick's energy, and I have all the confidence in the world in his leadership abilities." Voss has showed his faith in Dalesandro over the past few years as he gave his captain the ball to pitch in the summer finals game in 2012, the IHSA spring title game in 2013, and this summer's championship game, in which he recorded a complete game 3-1 victory over Nazareth Academy.

Voss also extends much of the credit for JCA's undefeated summer season – the first in the 39-year history of the

tournament – to three of his assistant coaches in particular: Kevin Campbell, Mark Siefert, and Jake Jaworski. All three of these coaches played for Voss at JCA.

Campbell, who played on the 2008 Hilltopper squad that finished 3rd in State, coached third base throughout most of the summer season. Siefert, a 2006 graduate of JCA, coaches the sophomore team during the spring and "was really involved in preparing the hitters, both physically and mentally, especially during the summer," said Voss. Jaworski, Voss's pitching coach and member of the 2000 State runnerup team, "does an incredible job teaching the pitchers composure in competitive situations and has developed an off-season conditioning program that is on par with D-1 colleges."

Keeping with the Joliet Catholic family theme, Voss recently brought back former JCA skipper, Rodeghero, to serve as varsity hitting coach.

"I've learned so much from baseball guys like Coach Rodeghero," said Voss. "I was young [24 years old] when I got this job and IHSCBA Hall of Famers like Rodeghero, Jim Hall [retired Lockport coach], Frank Ganser [retired Andrew coach], and Chuck Gandolphi [retired Carmel coach] taught me how to succeed in this great game and helped me to grow as a coach."

## 12 PRINCIPLES OF COACHING

- 1. It is not what the coach knows, but what the player knows.
- 2. Get the right player in the right position to be successful. Don't ask a player to do something that he cannot do.
- 3. Teach Technique...Make a player technique conscious.
- 4. Repetition repetition day after day after day
- 5. Preparation = performance Talk In meetings Act on the field Coach on the run
- 6. 4 Parts of Learning...
  - A. Explanation
  - B. Demonstration walk through
  - C. Practice repetition
  - D. Walk through correct mistakes
- 7. Mistakes Learn from your mistakes
  - A. See a mistake correct it... Ask yourself why and how?
  - B. Look for better ways to teach players...Drills should always have a purpose.
  - C. Don't complain about your players...they are the only ones you have. Be positive make them the best they can be.
- 8. Check after practice
  - A. Discuss Attitude, Effort, and Accomplishments after each practice.
  - B. Never allow a player to loaf in any baseball related activity.
- 9. Chemistry and Team Morale
  - A. More important than ever
  - B. Coach needs to show his players that he cares about them
  - C. Honesty, Trust, Communication
  - D. Door is always open to meet with players...Schedule formal meetings each year.
  - E. Strive to make players better Commitment
  - F. Make every player feel a part of the team... Everyone is important...

Everyone is treated in the same manner

- G. Do not give up on your players
- 10. Evaluate players daily
- 11. Never fail to talk with anyone about something that could help the baseball team
- 12. Strive to take yourself to the next level.
